


Travel

- 1. Kata
- 2. Team Kata
- 3. Enbu
- 4. Fukogo
- 5. Kumite
- 6. Team Kumite

Participants:

- Participants must actively practice traditional Karate-Do and be able to compete within the categories outlined in this document in accordance with WTKU Competition Rules
- In case of insufficient number of contestants for a particular category (minimum is 8 athletes in category) the corresponding category shall be merged with another category of similar age or grade
- Coaches are responsible for their respective team members
- KUMITE All athletes competing in Jiu-Kumite must wear a mouth guard and gloves. Athletes have to control distance. Contact is prohibited and will be strictly penalized.

Kata Flag Judging System: Performed in pairs by flag-system judging (two athletes perform kata given by the main judge at the same time). Main judge announces any HEIAN KATA name, but not higher than the lowest rank of athlete on tatami (kyu or Dan). Example: 8th kyu athlete competes with 7th kyu athlete, judge announces Heian Shodan Kata, not higher

Point Scoring Judging System: Athletes perform kata one by one. Order of participants is determined by point scoring. The higher the score, the higher the athlete's placement

General Rules for Team Categories, Groups A-D:

If the highest rank in your Team Kata or Enbu belongs to the higher category, your team will have to compete in the higher category

Group A and B competitors can mix for team events Group C and D competitors can mix for team events Group B and C competitors cannot mix for team events

Boys and Girls are allowed to be mixed in all teams, except for Team Kumite

6 kyu and higher ranked competitors can compete in Team Kata

4 kyu and higher ranked competitors can compete in Enbu

General Rules for Team Categories, Cadets-Seniors:

Only one Kata Team and one Enbu Team can qualify from each country for the WTKU 2024 World Championship

To qualify for Team Kata, the team needs to be made up of same sex participants

To qualify for Enbu, the team needs to be made up of male/male or male/female Participants

If the highest rank in your Team Kata or Enbu belongs to the higher category, your team will have to compete in the higher category

Cadets and Juniors can be mixed for team events, but there needs to be at least one Junior in the team in order to qualify as a team for Worlds

Youth and Seniors can be mixed for team events, but there needs to be at least on Senior in the team in order to qualify as a team for Worlds

Juniors and Youth can never mix in team events

<u>National Competition</u>: We will allow gender to be mixed freely, but please keep in mind that only teams according to the above rules can qualify for Worlds. Example: a Junior Kata Team, with 2 males and 1 female can win first place in the Nationals, but will not be qualified for Worlds. Should that happen, the highest placed team meeting the above regulations will be selected for Worlds



Individual Kata:

<u>Groups A-B</u>: Elimination, semi-final and final – Heian Kata, Flag Judging System

<u>Groups C-D</u>: Elimination, semi-final and final – Heian Kata for all groups (except groups 3rd kyu-dan), Flag Judging System

Groups C-D (3rd kyu-dan)

- Eliminations Flag Judging System, Only Heian Kata
- Semi-final and Final Tokui Kata (favorite kata). The Tokui Kata can be the same, or different, in the semi-final and final. Point Scoring Judging System in the semi-finals and finals

<u>Cadets-Seniors</u>: Point Scoring Judging System

Team Kata: (3 competitors simultaneous performance): Each Team will perform separately. Points Scoring system will be used. No Application (Bunkai) portion

Enbu: 2 Person Team demonstrates offense and defense within competition area, in given time: 60 seconds, +/- 5 seconds. Judges use Point Scoring system to determine the winner

Fukugo: An event that combines Kumite and Kata (using Kitei Kata as the competition kata), and Single Elimination Individual Kumite as the kumite portion. In round One, two competitors compete in kata, the winners then move on to round 2, in which they will compete in kumite, the winners moving on to round 3, in which they will compete in Kata, and so on. Final round is Kumite to determine overall winner

Individual Kumite:

Group A-D (8-7kyu): Kihon Ippon Kumite Group A-D (6kyu and higher): Jiu Kumite



<u>Jui Kumite (Free Sparring)</u>: The Kumite competition is made up of matches between two competitors free sparring without contact. The match winner is determined when a competitor achieves a scoring technique that meets the Ippon requirement (Todome Waza - Finishing Blow), which combines proper physical execution, correct timing, with effective distance (Ma-ai), in the scoring zone (2 Half Points – Wazari, is equal to 1 Ippon). The winner will be the competitor with the highest number of points, including points achieved and points awarded for penalty. If no points are scored, and no penalty points are given, the match will be determined by judge's decision. Single Elimination, but Repechage system may be substituted if deemed mor appropriate

Team Kumite (3 Person): Boys Team Kumite and Girls Team Kumite. Each member of the team will compete in one, 1 and ½ minute round. Each Round is scored the same as individual kumite. The team with the most points after the three rounds is the winner

This event will be open to Cadets/Juniors and Youth/Seniors only

Athlete Requirements

- Traditional white karate gi no rolled or cuffed pants or sleeves will be allowed
- Kumite athletes must have a mouth guard
- Kumite athletes must use competition gloves with padding (~4oz)
- Athletes may wear groin protection (men) or chest protection (women)
- No eye glasses or safety glasses permitted during kumite (free sparring)
- No jewelry of any type will be permitted to be worn by athletes (male or female)
- Only soft hair accessories will be permitted
- Fingernails and toenails must be trimmed short
- Hair must not impede the vision of the athlete
- No headgear, footpads, shoes, shin guards, or hard plastic/metal braces may be worn
